INTRODUCTION

ORDINANCE NO. 2614

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A CAP BANK FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2020 PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said final budget appropriations to 2.50% unless authorized by Ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations; and,

WHEREAS, a municipality may, by Ordinance, bank the difference between its final budget appropriations and the 3.5% increase authorized by this ordinance when said difference is not appropriated as part of the final budget; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Roselle Park, County of Union, hereby determines that this difference in the amount of \$140,719.10 that is not appropriated as part of the final 2020 budget shall be retained as an exception to the final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Roselle Park, County of Union, State of New Jersey that any amount authorized herein above that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this Ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within five (5) days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this Ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within five (5) days after such adoption.

RESOLUTION NO. 116-20

BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Roselle Park, County of Union, State of New Jersey does hereby accept the retirement of Teresa Mazzeo from the Borough of Roselle Park, current Clerk of the Department of Public Works, effective July 1, 2020.

RESOLUTION NO. 117-20

WHEREAS, the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act, P.L. 1987, c.102, has established a recycling fund from which tonnage grant may be made to municipalities in order to encourage local source separation and recycling programs; and,

WHEREAS, it is the intent and the spirit of the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act to use the tonnage grants to develop new municipal recycling programs and to continue and to expand existing programs; and,

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection has promulgated recycling regulations to implement the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act; and,

WHEREAS, the recycling regulations impose on municipalities certain requirements as a condition for applying for tonnage grants, including but not limited to, making and keeping accurate, verifiable records of materials collected and claimed by the municipality; and,

WHEREAS, a Resolution authorizing this municipality to apply for the 2019 Recycling Tonnage Grant will memorialize the commitment of this municipality to recycling and to indicate the assent of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Roselle Park to the efforts undertaken by the municipality and the requirements contained in the Recycling Act and recycling regulations; and,

WHEREAS, such a Resolution should designate the individual authorized to ensure the application is properly completed and timely filed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Roselle Park, County of Union, State of New Jersey hereby endorses the submission of the 2019 Recycling Tonnage Grant application to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and designates Recycling Coordinator Donna L. Corrigan to ensure that the application is properly filed; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the monies received from the Recycling Tonnage Grant be deposited in a dedicated Recycling Trust Fund to be used solely for the purpose of recycling.

RESOLUTION NO. 118-20

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Roselle Park, County of Union, State of New Jersey that they authorize the Tax Collector to direct the Treasurer to issue two (2) checks totaling \$51,764.26 payable to two (2) lien holders on two (2) properties; and,

RESOLUTION NO. 119-20

WHEREAS, the Borough of Roselle Park (hereinafter the “subrecipient”) wishes to apply for funding of approximately \$60,000.00 with a match of \$258,417.00 for an approximate project total cost of \$318,417.00 for a project under the 2020 State of New Jersey Safe and Secure Communities Program; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough of Roselle Park desires and requires to purchase equipment necessary for the acquisition of a new wood chipper apparatus for Department of Public Works; and,
