

Regular Meeting of Mayor and Council January 20, 2005

PRESENT: Mayor DeIorio; Councilmembers Badillo, Harms, Murphy, Zeglarski and Rubilla; Borough Attorney Bill Lane

ABSENT: Councilman Matarante

Mayor DeIorio called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. and said it is being held in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act and adequate notice of this meeting has been provided as required by law.

All contracts awarded by Mayor and Council must comply with the affirmative action requirements of P.L. 1975, C.127. (NJAC 17:27).

As required by the Fire Prevention Code, he indicated the fire exits and the procedure to be followed in case of fire.

Borough Clerk Arlene Triano read a short prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor DeLorio called Elliott Fidali to the dais. He said Elliott was Senior Captain, Running Back and Linebacker for the High School Football Team. He presented him with a Certificate of Achievement for his many accomplishments during the 2004 Football Season: Rushing for over 1,000 yards and the teams leading tackle on defense; 1st Team All Mountain Valley Conference; 1st Team All Union County; 2nd Team All State Group I; and leading scorer in Union County with 130 points. Elliott thanked Mayor, Council, his teammates and Coach Wagner for making his accomplishments possible.

Mayor DeLorio invited Ed Davenport to the dais. He said on January 6th the Borough marked the 10th Anniversary of televising Council meetings. He presented a Certificate of Appreciation to Ed Davenport in recognition of distinguished service and dedication to the Borough of Roselle Park in volunteering his time, experience and caring to Roselle Park Community Access Channel TV34. Mr. Davenport thanked Mayor and Council for taking the necessary steps to enhance the facility.

ADOPTION OF BY-LAWS & GUIDELINES

Councilman Badillo moved to adopt the 2005 By-Laws and Guidelines; seconded by Councilman Murphy.

Roll called, Councilmembers Badillo, Harms, Murphy and Rubilla voting Aye; Councilman Zeglarski voting No. There being four affirmatives and one negative, said motion was adopted.

PASSAGE OF ORDINANCES

Introduction

An Ordinance (#2144) entitled, "BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION OF \$150,000 FOR THE ACQUISITION OF A FRONT END LOADER BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF ROSELLE PARK IN THE COUNTY OF UNION, NEW JERSEY AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$142,500 IN BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH FOR FINANCING PART OF THE APPROPRIATION", was introduced and read by title only on its first reading. (See app. pg. #).

Councilman Badillo moved that Ordinance #2144 be adopted on first reading and advertised as prescribed by law for second reading and public hearing on February 17, 2005; seconded by Councilman Harms.

Roll called, all members voting Aye, said motion was adopted.

RESOLUTIONS

Roll called, all members voting Aye; said resolutions were adopted.

Resolution #35-05, Appointment of Police Officer in the Police Department (William Corbisiero), was offered by Councilman Badillo and seconded by Councilman Harms. (See app. pg. #).

Roll called, all members voting Aye, said resolution was adopted.

The Oath of Office was given to William Corbisiero by Mayor DeIorio, while his mother held the Bible, and his family looked on.

Mayor DeIorio congratulated and welcomed Officer Corbisiero to the Roselle Park Police Department. Councilman Badillo congratulated him and thanked him for his service in Iran and Iraq. Chief Wielgus said he was very happy to get this gentleman with this military background and the excellent job he did during his interview.

Officer Corbisiero thanked Mayor, Council, Chief Wielgus, his family and friends, saying he appreciated the opportunity and looked forward to working for the Roselle Park Police Department.

INTERRUPT THE REGULAR ORDER OF BUSINESS

Councilman Badillo moved, at 8:10 p.m., to interrupt the regular order of business for a 5 minute recess; seconded by Councilman Harms and adopted.

RESUME THE REGULAR ORDER OF BUSINESS

Councilman Badillo moved, at 8:15 p.m., to resume the regular order of business; seconded by Councilman Harms and adopted.

Councilman Murphy said he had a closed session matter regarding possible contract negotiations for the Historical Society.

Councilman Harms said he would like to discuss a tree on Roselle Avenue, that is on a parcel of Borough property, at the next Municipal Services Committee meeting. He said the Sidewalk Program is back again this year and, if residents have a sidewalk that is broken due to a tree they can pick up an application at Borough Hall. He noted that the deadline for applications is in June.

Mayor DeLorio indicated that there is another closed session item to discuss. Borough Attorney Bill Lane said they have developed a bid package with regard to leasing out a portion of land to one of four carriers of wireless communication in this area. He said a little more research needs to be done on what space will be available on municipal property for the installation of a monopole and the support structure. He said that information should be available within a week. He said at the next meeting Councilmembers could actually proceed towards the bidding process, and see if any of the carriers would be interested in leasing that space in the Borough. Mr. Lane said it would not only provide better telecommunication service, but also provide revenue to the Borough. He said tomorrow he would be meeting with members of the AT&T group, Chief Wielgus and Borough Engineer Ed Dec. Councilman Zeglarski noted that the City of Elizabeth is moving an ordinance very similar to Roselle Park's.

Mayor DeLorio said Councilmembers met the other day to discuss improvements to the Web-Site, as well as delivery of services via the Internet. He asked each member of the Governing Body to forward over their likes and dislikes in order to put together a question sheet and to move ahead with the process.

Councilman Rubilla said on January 10th he participated in the interview process with the Public Safety Committee and Officer Candidate William Corbisiero. He congratulated him and noted that he was an excellent candidate. He said on Tuesday he attended a Finance & Administration Committee Meeting regarding Web-Sites and got some feedback from vendors.

Councilman Badillo moved to authorize the Mayor and Borough Clerk to sign off on the agreement with the New Jersey State Association of Chiefs of Police, Inc. for written and oral examinations for the position of Police Officer and to advertise for applications for the examination; seconded by Councilman Harms and adopted.

Councilman Badillo said the written examination will be given on April 27th and applications could be picked up at Police Headquarters on February 11th.

Councilman Badillo moved that a raffle license be granted to the Church of the Assumption for an on-premise 50/50 raffle to be held on June 5, 2005; seconded by Councilman Harms and adopted.

Councilman Badillo moved that a raffle license be granted to the Church of the Assumption for an off-premise 50/50 raffle to be held on June 5, 2005; seconded by Councilman Harms and adopted.

Councilman Badillo moved to authorize the Purchasing Agent to advertise for the purchase of a Front End Loader; seconded by Councilman Harms and adopted.

Councilman Badillo moved to authorize the Purchasing Agent to advertise for Cell Tower Bids; seconded by Councilman Harms and adopted.

Councilman Badillo said he attended the Public Safety meeting at which they interviewed Officer Corbisiero, and said he was a great candidate who interviewed well. He said he also attended the Budget and Finance meeting where two technology companies gave presentations on their products. Councilman Badillo said he was not able to attend the Library meeting last night, so Councilman Murphy attended for him. He said he did speak with Susan who informed him she was still waiting to hear on some grants. He said she also brought up the mold issue in the building and noted that it needed to be re-addressed. Councilman Badillo said he also got to see the Snacks and Books Club which is facilitated by Kit Rubino, the Youth Services Coordinator, and said he wanted to acknowledge Kit at a Council meeting. Councilman Badillo noted that Vinny Lafano's father passed away and sent his condolences to the family.

Councilman Zeglarski said he wanted to comment on the Web Page discussions. He said they recently held a meeting and he wanted to thank everyone for participating. He said there were two finely matched companies which offered similar services in a different way. He said it would be good to see them compete to get our business because that brings prices down. He said the other issue he had to report on is the debris left by M&E Railroad on Valley Road at West Webster, saying he wanted to get a commitment from them to come and get rid of it. He assured Council that he would follow up and get rid of it. He said there are other issues with trees, that he would follow up on. Councilman Zeglarski said he had two closed session items to discuss, one about a legal bill submitted in September of 2004, and the other involving a letter received regarding the auction of land.

Mayor DeIorio said during the re-organization meeting he pointed out the need to look at the Borough's insurance cost and said he spoke to the Broker of Record to begin the process of analyzing our existing insurance. When Councilman Zeglarski asked if he could be invited to a committee meeting, Mayor DeIorio said he would invite him after he has time to gather some information for Council. Councilman Zeglarski said he also has some questions regarding the current coverage.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Councilman Badillo moved, at 8:30 p.m., to open the public comment portion of the meeting; seconded by Councilman Harms.

Dawn Fidali, 280 W. Webster Avenue, said she was there to announce an event that was going to be held at the Roselle Park High School on Saturday, February 19th.

She said they are going to hold their first Mr. Roselle Park High Pageant, and all proceeds are going to Project Graduation.

Bob Delarosa, 706 Galloping Hill Road, said he was a former Fire Chief with 38 years of volunteer service. He said sitting behind him was his youngest son, who in August 2003 was not reinstated to the Fire Department for reasons unbeknown to them. He said, a couple of weeks ago he wrote the Prosecutor's Office because of articles he read concerning violations to the Open Public Meetings Act. He said his son wrote a letter in November, 2003, and was never told it would be read and discussed at a Safety Meeting in December of 2003. He said the Prosecutor's Office told him to get copies of the minutes and the agenda. He said he filled out a records request form with the Borough Clerk, and four days later he received a reply that no minutes were taken at that meeting. He said the Prosecutor's Office then sent a letter to Mr. Lane indicating the Public Safety Committee violated the law. Mr. Delarosa said he did not know what the problem was, saying his son had over 10 years of service in the Fire Department. He said the Chief in the Fire Department could have handled this himself as a personnel matter. He said at no time were there any meetings with David; at no time was he called before any Officers or Commissioner, nor was he ever contacted. He said the letters he had from Mr. Signorello indicate no charges, and all it says is what happened on the 27th of June. Mr. Delarosa said when he spoke to the Chief about this, he was told that the Chief thought it went before Mayor and Council. He said, if it did, he would like to see minutes of that meeting. He said in 1997, when he was the Chief, he wrote up guidelines for discipline, and all the Deputy Chiefs had copies of them. He said he had a letter indicating a certain fireman was derelict of his duty; he was told what he was derelict of, and then he was told a meeting would be set up with the Fire Committee where he could come and explain. He said at no point was anything given to his son. He said he wrote the guidelines to keep things like this from happening. He said, at that time, Chief Signorello was his Deputy Chief, and he knows about those guidelines because they operated with them. He said at the time his son was immature, and on Father's Day his girlfriend died, and from that point on he thought drinking was the best thing, but with everyone helping him out he got straight. He said he should be given an opportunity to say something and be able to defend himself. He said his son David always had a good reputation and he would like him to get it back, saying he did not feel his son was fairly judged. Mr. Delarosa said his son applied to Kenilworth because he wants to stay in the Fire Service. He said after going through the fingerprints, and interview process, his son got a letter from Kenilworth, saying, upon receipt of a letter from Roselle Park, he could not be accepted. He said when David inquired he was told that there were no situations mentioned. Mr. Delasrosa said, if there were no situations mentioned what was in the letter from Roselle Park, that stopped him from being accepted.

Councilman Harms noted that Mr. Delarosa went over his time, but under the circumstances he was allowed. He noted that no other residents would be allowed to speak over the 5 minutes. Mayor DeIorio told Mr. Delarosa that he would get a response back from the Fire Chief. He said he could not respond to his statement from Kenilworth because he did not know about it. He assured him he would get a response from the

Chief and no personnel issues have come up from this Governing Body. He asked Mr. Delarosa to forward his correspondence to Council, so they could respond.

Jacob Magiera, 612 Sheridan Avenue, said he came across paperwork that the Borough's Tax Collector went to a Rutgers University class, and that class cost taxpayers \$570.00. He asked why the Mayor did not buy him a \$12.00 tape to save him a lot of money; Mayor DeIorio said there were no tapes available. Mr. Magiera said he still felt Council should go for retraining with the Rutgers Course. Mr. Magiera said the Borough electric bill was approximately \$75,817.80 just for Borough buildings. He said he did not know if that included the acorn lamps for street lighting at the cost of \$112,185.50 which is a total of \$187,000.00 for electricity. He said if that could be cut 10% it would save taxpayers money. He asked what the cost would be for the Roselle Park Web-Site. Mayor DeIorio said the Borough was looking at two vendors and negotiating for pricing. Councilman Zeglarski said he could give a ballpark as to what it would cost per year because what they are competing against each other. He said it probably will be more than \$10,000.00 the first year and then be significantly reduced to maintain it over time. Mayor DeIorio and Councilman Harms said he was incorrect, it may only cost Borough residents \$5,000.00. Councilman Zeglarski said Council's intention is to bid out the project. He said he was speaking in general numbers and Councilman Harms was correct. Mr. Magiera thanked Councilman Zeglarski for attempting to give any answer. Mr. Magiera said Channel 34 today is a result of residents who subscribe to Comcast pushing Mayor and Council to act to give residents the audio and reception they are paying to see. He said it was nice to see the people come in for their achievements and the Police Department awards. He said, for each company that wants to install an antenna, the Borough should charge 10% of their gross. Mr. Magiera said senior citizens should get 7 ½ minutes to address Mayor and Council. He read an article entitled "Convention must address Governing Spending" by Assemblyman Eric Munoz. He noted that utility costs are going up sky high and that is why he mentioned the cost of electric. He said when Councilman Zeglarski first came on Council he proposed a resolution regarding a property tax convention for the State of New Jersey, and Mr. Magiera suggested having a municipal tax convention in Roselle Park.

Josephine Churchill, 716 Galloping Hill Road, said David Delarosa is one of the finest boys you would want to meet, has done a lot of favors for her, and is a good guy that deserves to have his job back. She said her grandson just graduated from the Police Academy and applied in Roselle Park but was told there were no openings, and yet 2 fellows were just hired. She said the poor kid is struggling and asked if there was anything that could be done for him. She said she watched Council meetings on TV34 and, one particular night, she was very depressed because while Councilman Zeglarski was saying something the other 3 were sitting there laughing and ignoring him completely. She said the people voted for him and he had just as much a right to speak as anyone else, and he should be given the courtesy of being listened to.

Councilman Badillo said Roselle Park has a standing police list for a test. He said that means individuals on that list paid \$50.00 in 2003 for written, physical and oral exams to get a rated number. He said Mayor and Council have 10 or 11 on the standing

list. He said Joe Churchill is a fine, young man who took the alternate route and, for legal reasons, Roselle Park will not pursue alternate routes while there are people on the list that actually took the test and are waiting to be hired. Councilman Badillo said he wanted the public to know that in no way, shape or form has Joe been overlooked. He said the Police Chief has been forwarding Joe's name and resume in an attempt to help the young man because he is a resident of Roselle Park.

There being no one else wishing to speak, Councilman Badillo moved, at 9:05 p.m., to close the public comment portion of the meeting; seconded by Councilman Harms and adopted.

Mayor DeIorio read the closed session resolution and said Council would be discussing the following:

- . Legal bill submitted in December 2004 (Spagnoli)
- . Auction of Borough property – Woodside Ave.

INTERRUPT THE REGULAR ORDER OF BUSINESS

Councilman Harms moved to interrupt the regular order of business for a closed session meeting; seconded by Councilman Badillo and adopted.

RESUME THE REGULAR ORDER OF BUSINESS

Councilman Harms moved, at 9:40 p.m., to resume the regular order of business; seconded by Councilman Badillo and adopted.

Mayor DeIorio said during closed session Council discussed matters pertaining to Historical Society negotiations, legal fees submitted in December 2004 (Spagnoli) and the vacation of property requested by Mr. Meola.

Mayor DeIorio on the recommendation of the Fire Chief, appointed the following as members of the Roselle Park Fire Department, Lorraine Firehouse #1, effective immediately:

- . Joseph T. Capone, 126 Camden Street, Roselle Park**
- . Sean Patrick O'Callahn, 423 Birch Street, Roselle Park**

Mayor DeIorio appointed Barbara Balaban and Allan Cohen as Constables for a one year term expiring on December 31, 2005.

Mayor DeIorio asked the Borough Clerk to prepare a resolution authorizing Keith Heyman to sign off on the receipt of goods and services that are ordered for TV34. He said currently he is signing off on the requisition, as the Department Head, but he does

not receive the items and, since Keith does, it only makes sense that Keith should sign off and be held accountable.
