##### Councilwoman Chen-Hoerning

- Attended the 911 Remembrance Services.
- Attended Cruisin' Car Night on Saturday.
- Attended the Library Magic Show on Monday at the Casano Center.
- Congratulated the Cub Scouts that were the Color Guard for the Somerset Patriots.
- Attended the Historical Society Meeting.
- Asked if the Historical Society can get one of the fire boxes.
- Suggested the fire box be given to the Historical Society on permanent loan.

Mr. Johnstone suggested they give it to the Historical Society as a loan on behalf of the town and this way the town will still own it.

Councilman Badillo said the Fire Department did bring up the suggestion of donating one of the boxes to the Historical Society.

- Councilwoman Chen-Hoerning asked if Roselle Park is participating in the Union County Centennial Parade in October.

Mayor DeIorio said the Public Safety Departments are active in support of their colleagues, whether it is a county or municipal level.

- Councilwoman Chen-Hoerning asked how service members can be reported to the town.
- Asked about the Zoning Board link on the Borough website.
- Spoke about a frat house that is in Roselle Park and how it can be taken care of.

##### Councilman Miranda

- Spoke about a 7 year old boy named Andrew Weber from Roselle Park who started a charity called "Beds for Kids".
- After he learned that some children sleep on the floor he fundraised for 8 months and gave a bed to a child in Elizabeth.

- He collected cans and recycled.
- Asked Ms. Cali to contact him and his family to come in and be recognized.

#### Councilman Matarante

- Reminded the residents on E. Clay Avenue the street paving from Spruce Street to Galloping Hill Road will begin.
- Thanked Karen Intile for putting together the 911 Remembrance Ceremony at the gazebo.
- Thanked everyone that spoke at the event and it was a very emotional night.
- Was proud of all our Public Safety Departments and the police honor guard.
- Spoke about adding two more parking spots to the lot in front of the building.

Mayor DeIorio said they will have to coordinate with the DPW because some re-stripping will be involved.

#### Councilman Badillo

- Spoke with the residents on Willow Avenue regarding the street reconstruction.
- The residents were a little concerned about the garbage and bulk waste pickups.
- The pickups will take place early before the construction crews are there.
- Would like to meet with the Engineering Dept. to see if there is a minimum width of the street because of the many trees in the area when reconstructing streets.
- Some parents are requesting starting pre-school programs for children and would like to discuss that with the Recreation Committee.
- Attended a Dad's Club Meeting and they will be having many fundraisers in the future.
- Would like to have the streets cleaned when reconstruction of streets is done.
- Attended the 911 Ceremony and thanked everyone involved.
- Thanked the Fire Department, First Aid Squad, Police Department and DPW for their work during the last storm.
- As the streets were block by the horses and cones, people were moving them and still going through them; they are there for everyone's safety.
- Attended the Public Safety Meeting.
- Attended the Joint Sewer Meeting.
- Thanked the DPW for cleaning Loreti Park and putting in an extra garbage can.
- There is debris on Sumner Avenue at the end of Elm Street; the Code Enforcement Officer has contacted Union and Kenilworth and no one wants to clean it up.
- Would like a letter sent to both Mayors saying we want the area cleaned up.

#### Councilman Yakubov

- Spoke to the Clerk to schedule a Neighborhood Watch Meeting and that will take place on October 24<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. in Borough Hall.
- September 27<sup>th</sup> there will be a hazardous material pickup at Union County College in Cranford.

- The traffic issue on W. Roselle Avenue is partly due to the reconstruction of the back parking lot in Colfax Manor.
- The current protocol for the construction company repaving the streets is to notifying the residents on the block.
- As a Borough, we should provide more information; specifically as to when a street will be reconstructed.
- Some residents that did not live on the street, but on a corner, were also affected by the reconstruction.

#### Councilman Dinardo

- Attended the 911 Memorial Service; thanked all those involved.
- Attended the Board of Health Meeting.
- Attended the Library Board Meeting; they are getting four new laptop computers.
- Received a letter from two young residents regarding more recycle bins being placed around the Borough.
- Received a letter from a resident about a healthy tree hanging over his house. He is having difficulty getting insurance for his home because of the branch.

Councilman Badillo said he was at the resident's house, along with the DPW and the tree expert and Mr. Wirzbicki said it is a healthy tree and they will not cut it down. The resident did bring up that the insurance carrier is giving him a hard time. The issue is there is an insurance person that is not a tree expert telling them to cut it down. If we were to cut his branch, then the tree would be lopsided and the whole tree would have to come down. He would like everyone come before the municipal services committee to discuss it.

Mayor DeIorio agreed all involved should come in to discuss this issue.

Councilwoman Chen-Hoerning asked if we are liable if our experts determine it should not be taken down, and then it does fall on the resident's home.

Councilman Dinardo brought up the recycling at the schools and fields.

Ms. Cali said she called the schools and told them to contact Great Northern Recycling and encouraged them to start a recycling program in the school system and also offered them the cans we have.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Councilman Badillo moved to open the public comment portion of the meeting; seconded by Councilman Miranda.

Jacob Magiera, 612 Sheridan Avenue

- Everyone should take pride in our military personnel.
- Acknowledged Mr. Garrison for traveling to Paris Island whenever a marine from Roselle Park graduated.
- Asked about the Planning and Zoning Board Meetings being broadcast on TV34.

- Thanked Councilman Matarante for pursuing the two extra handicapped parking spaces; which will make a total of three.
- Asked if the town is in ongoing litigation with Great Northern Recycling.
- Asked for an update on Guarriello-Dec.
- Asked for an update on AvalonBay.

Mayor DeIorio said there will be a public outreach meeting where AvalonBay will present any matters that were discussed between the Borough and AvalonBay. There are still outstanding issues that still need to be resolved. The courts have mandated the negotiations be continued.

Mr. Johnstone said the members of Council have been instructed not to speak about it per order of the court.

- Mr. Magiera said there are 9,000 people in Union County who have not filed for the Federal Stimulus check.
- There are missing bolts and rivets in the decorative metal fence at Aldene Park.

Mayor DeIorio said the fence has not been cut through, as opposed to chain link fence.

- Mr. Magiera spoke about pigeon droppings on the sidewalks under the Locust Street bridges.
- The town is responsible for the sidewalks and the County is responsible for the streets and storm sewer catch basins.

The DPW has attempted to make every effort to address cleaning the pigeon droppings.

- Mr. Magiera said the 911 Remembrance Services were very emotional.
- There are about five Police Chiefs from various communities living in Roselle Park.
- The fire alarms boxes should be distributed to the three Fire Departments and be awarded to volunteer firemen, Library and Historical Society.

Mayor DeIorio said there is a legal issue regarding the distribution of the fire boxes. If the fire boxes are to be given out, there has to be a public auction involved. If there is a means to provide the Fire Department with the boxes, that still makes the town in compliance with the law that will be done.

- Mr. Magiera asked about the transparency resolution.

Mayor DeIorio said Councilwoman Chen-Hoerning, Saul Qersdyn and he have had meetings to discuss this issue. They met with Ms. Cali to go over the mechanics of updating websites. The Borough is actively working to change the provider of the website; right now we have an agreement with Union County, through an Interlocal Agreement to provide IT services. When the County comes in, we would like them to provide the website services, but wanted to make sure they could provide the update that is necessary on the website.

- Mr. Magiera spoke about the West Nile virus and how it is passed on.

Glenn Marczewski, 622 Sherman Avenue

- Thanked the Garrison Family for their years in the Armed Forces.
- Asked what Section #40-2302 means pertaining to Borough Ordinance #2251.

Ms. Cali said #40-2302 is a section of the Code Book. The ordinance is a recommendation from the Code Enforcement Officer that some of the stores are blocking the windows with shelving and racks making it unattractive. The ordinance will prohibit this and 80% of the overall glass surface must be free from obstruction. This only applies to storage of materials, stock and inventory in a business.

Councilman Badillo said it is also for safety; if the windows are blocked, police officers cannot see inside the establishment.

- Mr. Marczewski asked about Resolution #208-08 and where does the money come from.

Ms. Cali said this money comes from money that was already appropriated in the Capital Budget.

- Mr. Marczewski asked how many grants have been applied for.

Mayor DeIorio said this information can be provided to him through our Chief Financial Officer. The Borough cannot apply for grants until they are sure what will be done with the money.

- Mr. Marczewski spoke about child abduction and we, as adults, can prevent it.

Mayor DeIorio said by supporting laws such as the Jessica Lunsford Act, which he has spoken about for the last three years. Assemblyman Munoz worked diligently to get the Jessica Lunsford Act; she was a young girl who was abducted and murdered by a repeat sex offender. The law in Florida, which is stronger than the law in New Jersey, still has not been passed because of the Governor and the majority in the Assembly and Senate. The repeat offenders before they can assault or murder another child should be kept in jail for life so they will not be walking the streets and watching the playgrounds. Letters can be written to the Assembly Speaker, Governor and Senate President to pass laws like the Jessica Lunsford Act in New Jersey.

Councilman Badillo said many members of the Governing Body are involved in Community Services. There are a great amount of volunteers in the town and if they stay active the kids know you and feel safe; there is a sense of community. There is a young core of police officers getting to know the children.

Mayor DeIorio said they ask parents to participate in the various programs to have their child's information handy should they be abducted; whether it is a print, dental imprint or photo.

Councilman Badillo said it is a community effort, not just the responsibility of the Governing Body or the schools. They are always looking for volunteers to get involved to create a positive and safe atmosphere for our children to be able to participate in things.

Eugene Meola, 236 Sheridan Avenue

- Has had a problem with a tree for a long period of time.
- The insurance company is giving him a problem about his coverage.
- Councilman Badillo was supposed to supply him with a letter that the tree was fine but he never received it.

Councilman Badillo said he would have a tree expert look at the tree. After he received the report, he called Mr. Meola and as a follow up he had Frank Wirzbicki go back for his opinion. It has not been forgotten and he has been following it up.

- Mr. Meola said he is concerned with the winter coming, it will get worse.
- Just wants the branch cut back.
- Asked what the town liability would be if the tree falls.

Mayor DeIorio said they would like the representative of the insurance company available to meet with them.

- Mr. Meola said he has the right to be in his home and not worry about a branch falling on his home and it is going to fall.
- If no one wants to address it, then he will have to pursue it legally.

Mayor DeIorio said they are trying to help and if he has any information from his insurance company, they would like to speak to them.

- Mr. Meola asked that the branch at least be trimmed back, so it will not hit the house and land in the front yard.

Mayor DeIorio asked if the dangerous branch is removed, will the insurance company then be satisfied. If that is all they are concerned with, then we can end the problem right here.

Councilman Badillo said he gave Mr. Meola the option of having the insurance company call the town. We have to think of the precedent we are setting on the opinion of an insurance person who is not a tree expert.

- Mr. Meola said he would pay to remove the tree if necessary.
- Asked what the town's liability is if the tree should fall.

Mayor DeIorio said he will get that information for him.



Andy Casais, 166 Berywn St.

- Asked why the flags on Westfield Avenue were not lowered to ½ staff on September 12<sup>th</sup>.

Mayor DeIorio said the Borough normally receives a notice from the Governor's or President's Office and we did not. This was brought to his attention and he apologized for it not being done.

Laura Hahn, 40 E. Sumner Avenue

- Speaking as the TV34 Chairwoman.
- At the last meeting the suggestion was made about televising the Planning and Zoning Board meetings.
- Understands the suggestion, but disagrees.
- TV34 schedule is shared between the High School and the town.
- The school schedules their programs are on Sunday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday.
- The Borough plays Council Meetings, which can vary in length from 1 ½ hours to 3 hours or more, which makes it difficult to schedule.
- Historical Society and Relay for Life tapes are also played.
- Parades and special ceremonies are also played.
- The Borough can only play a certain amount of tapes at a certain time.
- The Borough Technician only works ten hours per week, which also makes it difficult to tape meetings and program them.
- It is not budgeted for the Borough Technician to work extra hours.
- There would be an additional cost and it would have to be increased.

Mayor DeIorio said there is an allotment for Mr. Hyman's salary depending on the number of hours he works; that is the number of hours that are allocated. It has been budgeted for the entire year.

- Ms. Hahn said the liaison to the Planning and Zoning Board could report the highlights of those meetings at the Council Meetings.

Mayor DeIorio asked if a Zoning or Planning Board Meeting were televised, what other tapes would have to be given up for that time.

- Ms. Hahn said they may have to take off a Historical Society tape or not be able to play other tapes twice per day.

Mayor DeIorio asked if perhaps the school would give up some of their hours, and Ms. Hahn said they try to schedule programs so people will see them.

Mayor DeIorio asked if Mr. Hyman could provide the Governing Body with a snapshot of the programming that takes place on TV34 on a weekly basis, using September as an example. At the beginning of Council Meetings, he will announce the scheduled meetings for the various boards so people can attend.

There being no one else wishing to speak, Councilman Badillo to close the public portion; seconded by Councilman Miranda and adopted.

ORDINANCES

INTRODUCTION

ORDINANCE NO. 2251

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE XXIII, SECTION 40-2302  
OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ROSELLE PARK  
FOR PERMITTED USES

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Roselle Park, County of Union, State of New Jersey that Article XXIII, Section 40-2302(B)(1) of the Borough Code is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION 1: 40-2302 PERMITTED USES

B. (1) Storage of materials, stock or inventory shall not be permitted in any window display area ordinarily exposed to public view. All screening of windows shall be maintained in a clean and attractive manner. All windows must be free of any displays or signs. Up to 80% of the overall size of the glass surface must be free of any obstruction (such as inventory, displays or signs).

SECTION 2: If any section or portion of a section of this Code shall be invalid for any reason, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections or portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 3: All ordinances or parts of ordinances, to the extent that they are inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4: This amendment to the Code of the Borough of Roselle Park shall become effective upon publication and in accordance with law.

Councilman Badillo moved that Ordinance #2251 be adopted on first reading and advertised as prescribed by law for second reading and public hearing on October 2, 2008; seconded by Councilman Yakubov.
