ORDINANCE NO. 2475

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER VI, SECTION 6-4.2  
OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ROSELLE PARK  
ENTITLED REGULATION OF LICENSES SUNDAYS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Roselle Park, County of Union, and State of New Jersey that Chapter 6, Section 6-4.2 be and here is amended as follows:

SECTION 1.

6-4.2 Sundays.

No licensee shall sell, serve, deliver or allow, or permit the sale, service and delivery or consumption of any alcoholic beverage on a Sunday between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m.

SECTION 2: If any section or portion of a section of this Code shall be invalid for any reason, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections or portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 3: All ordinances or parts of ordinances, to the extent that they are inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4: This amendment to the Code of the Borough of Roselle Park shall become effective upon publication and in accordance with law.

Borough Clerk Cali said the purpose of this is to allow the delivery, sale and consumption of any alcoholic beverage on Sunday between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m. This is being done because you cannot amend an ordinance with a resolution. This ordinance will be up for adoption on October 20<sup>th</sup>.

Councilman Shiple asked what taverns requested this. Is there any way this could be temporary.

Mayor Hokanson said this is time sensitive, so there is not enough time.

Councilman Shiple said we are changing a law for people to drink alcohol at 9:00 a.m. It is important to understand the ramifications when changing a law. He understands that this came up quite suddenly.

Chief Morrison said that there is not that much of a difference in time and the taverns are still bound by ABC laws. He said the other thing is that the Police will have to monitor the situation.

Councilwoman Storey moved that Ordinance No. 2475 be adopted on first reading and advertised as prescribed by law for second reading and public hearing on October 20, 2016; seconded by Councilman Elmarassy.
