

**ORDINANCE NO. 2336**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE VI, OF THE CODE OF THE  
BOROUGH OF ROSELLE PARK TO INCLUDE SECTION 6-8  
REGARDING POSSESSION OR CONSUMPTION BY UNDERAGE  
PERSONS ON PRIVATE PROPERTY**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Roselle Park, County of Union, State of New Jersey that Chapter VII, Section 6-8 of the Borough Code is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:

**SECTION 1: 6-8 POSSESSION OR CONSUMPTION BY UNDERAGE  
PERSONS ON PRIVATE PROPERTY.\***

**6-8.1 Possession or Consumption of Alcoholic Beverages by Underage Person on Private Property Prohibited.**

It is hereby unlawful for any **person** under the legal age to, without legal authority, knowingly possess or knowingly consume an alcoholic beverage on private property. Any person under the legal age to purchase alcoholic beverages who knowingly possesses or consumes any alcoholic beverage in or on any school property, public conveyance, public place or place of public assembly or on private property shall be in violation of this article.

**6-8.2 Violations and Penalties.**

a. Any **person** found guilty of violating the terms of this section shall be subject to a fine of two hundred fifty (\$250.00) dollars for the first offense and a fine of three hundred fifty (\$350.00) dollars for any subsequent offense; perform community service for a period not to exceed 180 days; and, if considered necessary by the court, be referred to an alcohol treatment program at the defendant's expense; at the discretion of the court, upon a finding of guilty, in addition to the fine authorized for this offense, suspend or postpone for six (6) months the driving privileges of the defendant. Upon the conviction of any **person** and the suspension or postponement of that **person's** driver's license, the court shall forward a report to the Division of Motor Vehicles stating the first and last day of the suspension or postponement period imposed by the court pursuant to this section. If a **person** at the time of the imposition of a sentence is less than seventeen (17) years of age, the period of license postponement, including a suspension or postponement of the privilege of operating a motorized bicycle, shall commence on the day the sentence is imposed and shall run for a period of six (6) months after the **person** reaches the age of seventeen (17) years. If the defendant at the time of the imposition of the sentence has a valid driver's license issued by this State, the court shall immediately collect the license and forward it to the Division of Motor Vehicles along with the report. If for any reason the license cannot be collected, the court shall include in the report the complete name, address, date of birth, eye

color, and sex of the **person**, as well as the first and last date of the license suspension period imposed by the court.

b. The court shall inform the **person** orally and in writing that if the **person** is convicted of operating a motor vehicle during the period of license suspension or postponement, the **person** shall be subject to the penalties set forth in N.J.S.A. 39:3-40. The defendant shall be required to acknowledge receipt of the written notice in writing. Failure to receive a written notice or failure to acknowledge in writing the receipt of the written notice shall not be a defense to a subsequent charge of a violation of N.J.S.A. 39:3-40.

c. If the **person** convicted under this section is not a New Jersey resident, the court shall suspend or postpone, as appropriate, the nonresident driving privilege of the **person** based on the age of the **person** and submit to the Division the required report. The court shall not collect the license of a nonresident convicted under this section. Upon receipt of a report by the court, the Division shall notify the appropriate officials in the licensing jurisdiction of the suspension or postponement.

### **6-8.3 Exceptions.**

a. This section shall not prohibit an **underage person** from consuming or possessing an alcoholic beverage in connection with a religious observance, ceremony, or rite or consuming or possessing an alcoholic beverage in the presence of and with the permission of a parent, guardian or relative who has attained the legal age to purchase and consume alcoholic beverages.

b. This section shall not prohibit the possession of alcoholic beverages by any **underage person** while actually engaged in the performance of employment by a **person** who has been licensed under Title 33 of the Revised Statutes, or while actively engaged in the preparation of food while enrolled in a culinary arts or hotel management program at a County vocational school or post-secondary educational institution; however, this section shall not be construed to preclude the imposition of a penalty under this section, N.J.S.A. 33:1-81, or any other section of law against a **person** who is convicted of unlawful alcoholic beverage activity on or at premises licensed for the sale of alcoholic beverages.

### **6-8.4 Definitions.**

As used in this section, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated.

*Guardian* shall mean a **person** who has qualified as a guardian of the **underage person** pursuant to a testamentary or court appointment.

*Relative* shall mean the **underage person's** grandparent, aunt or uncle, sibling, or any other **person** related by blood or affinity.

**SECTION 2:** If any section or portion of a section of this Code shall be invalid for any reason, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections or portions of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 3:** All ordinances or parts of ordinances, to the extent that they are inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 4:** This amendment to the Code of the Borough of Roselle Park shall become effective upon publication and in accordance with law.
