## **Police Chief's Monthly Report for February 2016**

I am pleased to report that Officer William Hannon has been selected to receive the Roselle Park Knights of Columbus Officer of the Year award for 2015. Officer Hannon was chosen as the recipient of the 2015 Officer of the year award based on the highest number of arrests, and motor vehicle summonses issued by an officer, as well as an outstanding sick record with 0 sick time for 2015. During the year 2015 Officer Hannon had a recorded 119 arrests, and 745 motor vehicle summonses issued. Officer Hannon will receive this award at the Knights of Columbus annual dinner on March 5, 2016. Congratulations to Officer Hannon on a job well done in serving the community of Roselle Park. As a side note, I was discussing Officers Hannon's accomplishment with an officer from another Police Department in Union County, and that officer informed me that Officer Hannon had more arrests, and summonses issued in 2015 than their entire Police Department. This is a clear indication of Officer Hannon's outstanding work ethic, and dedication to the Roselle Park Police Department, and the community of Roselle Park.

On February 3, 2016 myself, and Detective Cocca attended a meeting with the Federal Emergency Management Agency ( FEMA ) to discuss the possibility of receiving emergency reimbursement funding through a Public Assistance grant which would allow Roselle Park to receive emergency funding as a result of the January 23, 2016 snow storm. As a result of this meeting Roselle Park has been authorized to begin the process of filing all required documentation with FEMA regarding all overtime costs that were incurred by the Police Department, Department of Public Works, and Board of Education personnel for a three day period as a result of the storm, this time period shall also include

the cleanup period following the storm. Roselle Park Office of Emergency Management ( OEM ) has begun the process of obtaining all data regarding overtime costs, and equipment that was utilized, and also all equipment that was rented to help with the cleanup period. This will be a timely process and I will keep you updated as to the progress of this process.
