RECYCLING & BULK WASTE FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: WHAT IS CONSIDERED VEGETATIVE WASTE?

A: Vegetative Waste is a type of recyclable material consisting of all dead plant life, flowers, wood chips and shavings, fruits from trees (i.e. apples and pears), small branches and twigs (up to two inches in diameter and not exceeding four feet in length, bundled and tied), grass cuttings, leaves or other vegetative plants or clippings; specifically excludes: large limbs (over two inches in diameter) tree trunks, stumps, and roots.

Q: WHAT IS A SUITABLE CONTAINER FOR VEGETATIVE WASTE?

A: A container not larger than 35 gallons equipped with a pull handle or handles, or biodegradable paper bags, or otherwise bundled and tied. Plastic bags of any type are expressly prohibited.

Q: WHEN CAN I PLACE VEGETATIVE WASTE CURBSIDE?

A: Any time after 7:00 p.m. on the evening before the scheduled pickup.

Q: WHAT IS CONSIDERED GENERAL RECYCLING?

A: General Recycling is the traditional type of recycling collection provided by the Borough consisting of plastic bottles and containers (coded #1 & #2), paper, newspaper, magazines, junk mail, catalogs, phone books, aluminum and tin cans, glass bottles and jars, clean corrugated / cardboard boxes, clean milk, juice, and food cartons.

Q: WHAT IS A SUITABLE CONTAINER FOR GENERAL RECYCLING?

A: An uncovered container made of metal, rubber, or plastic not larger than 32 gallons with a total weight (per container) of not more than 50 pounds. Plastic bags of any type are expressly prohibited.

Q: DOES GENERAL RECYCLING NEED TO BE SEPARATED?

A: YES. YES. YES. Glass, plastics, and metals can be co-mingled. Paper and cardboard products must be bundled and tied separately with twine (duct tape or wire is not acceptable binding).

Q: WHEN CAN I PLACE GENERAL RECYCLING CURBSIDE?

A: Any time after 7:00 p.m. on the evening before the scheduled pickup.

Q: WHAT IS CONSIDERED BULK WASTE?

A: Bulk Waste is a type of solid waste consisting of furniture, toys, mattresses (limited 2 per address), wood (limit of two – 32 gallon containers with pieces cut into 3 foot pieces except for wood doors, storm windows, storm doors, doors, windows, wood fences, lawn furniture and wood products generated during minor repairs nor requiring a zoning or construction permit). BULK WASTE SHALL EXPLICITLY EXCLUDE: rugs, carpeting, electronic waste, ashes, dirt, tree trunks, stumps, branches, brush, leaves, household garbage, pool filters, railroad ties, rocks, stones, asphalt, concrete, closed-top drums, automobile parts, appliances (i.e. refrigerators, washers, dryers), paint, chemicals, and materials resulting from demolition, alterations or repairs to buildings or other structures not generated by the homeowner and not generated from pickup sites requiring permits.

Q: ARE THERE LIMITATIONS ON THE BULK WASTE I CAN DISPOSE?

A: Disposal is limited to 500 pounds (one-quarter ton) per property, per pickup.

Q: WHEN CAN I PLACE BULK WASTE CURBSIDE?

A: Any time after 12:00 p.m. (noon) the day before the scheduled pickup.
